**April 11, Saint Gemma Galgani (1878-1903):
Her life was tied to Jesus' suffering**

After receiving her First Communion Gemma, pointing to her heart, said to a classmate, "I feel a fire burning here. ... Do you feel like that?"

From an early age, Gemma cultivated a deep love of Jesus and a devotion to His Sacred Passion. During her short life, she was able to unite many sufferings to those of her Savior. Her mother died when Gemma was only 19, and she became a second mother to her seven siblings. She ardently desired to enter a convent, but the poor health that plagued her prevented this. She was the recipient of many mystical experiences and special graces. Misunderstood and ridiculed, Gemma offered these "heartaches" in reparation, uniting them to Our Lord's own.

In June of 1899, on the eve of the feast of the Sacred Heart, Gemma experienced an internal warning that some unusual grace was to be granted her, and so it happened: she was impressed with the wounds of the stigmata. Each Thursday evening, she fell into ecstasy. The stigmata appeared and remained until Friday afternoon or Saturday morning. The wounds closed when the bleeding stopped, and only white marks remained in the place of the deep gashes. At the end of her ecstasies, she returned to normal and carried on quietly and serenely. Eventually her confessor advised Gemma to pray for a cessation of this occurrence, due to her extremely poor health. The phenomenon ceased, but the white marks remained until her death. After her death, witnesses testified that there was no artfulness in Gemma's manner.

Gemma suffered much within her own family. Her confessor arranged a home for her where she found more freedom for her spiritual life. She saw her guardian angel often, and frequently sent him on errands.

In January of 1903, Gemma was diagnosed with tuberculosis. Her suffering intensified during Holy Week until her death on Holy Saturday, April 11. The Parish Priest in her company said, "She died with a smile which remained upon her lips, so that I could not convince myself that she was really dead."

Here are five inspiring quotes from St Gemma Galgani on the Passion of Jesus:

- ♥ ".....Jesus appeared with all His wounds open, but blood no longer came from them. Rather, flames of fire issued forth from them and in an instant these flames came to touch my hands, my feet and my heart. I felt as if I would die."
- ♥ "Let me embrace You, heavenly Bridegroom, source of all my consolations. Who am I, to speak so boldly with You? It is true, I am Your creature, but I am bad; It is true that I was made by Your hands, and those very hands, oh Jesus, I pierced with nails....I got going too late, Jesus, in coming to You....I found You, Jesus....I found You...I call You, I invoke You, because I am sure. But where are You? Where are You hiding? Give me wings, Jesus, to fly to your house in heaven."
- ♥ "If you really want to love Jesus, first learn to suffer, because suffering teaches you to love."
- ♥ "Do grant, oh my God, that when my lips approach Yours to kiss You, I may taste the gall that was given to You; when my shoulders lean against Yours, make me feel Your scourging; when my flesh is united with Yours in the Holy Eucharist, make me feel Your Passion; when my head comes near Yours, make me feel Your thorns; when my heart is close to Yours, make me feel Your spear."
- ♥ "Why did you suffer for me, dear Jesus? For love! The nails...the crown...the cross...all for the love of me! For You I sacrifice everything willingly. I offer You my body with all of its weakness, and my soul with all its love."

Blessed Lamb! on Calvary's mountain
slain to take our sins away;
Let the drops of that rich fountain
our tremendous ransom pay;
Sacred Savior! Sacred Savior!
lowly at Thy feet we pray.

Blessed Lamb! vouchsafe us pardon
in Thy love our souls confide;
By Thy groans within the garden,
by the death which Thou hast died,
Let Thy Passion, let Thy Passion
evermore with us abide!

So shall peace, sweet peace be given,
purchase of Thy precious pain;
So shall earth but lead to heaven,
since for us the Lamb was slain;
Dear Redeemer! dear Redeemer!
Thou canst not have died in vain.
