**Faith of our Fathers, Holy Faith! We will be true to thee ‘til death: Saint Ubaldus**



Gubbio is famous for the *Wolf of Gubbio* story associated with St Francis of Assisi. It is better known locally on account of the saint we honor this Thursday, Saint Ubaldus.

Ubaldus was born in Gubbio, and having lost his father very young, was educated by his uncle, the Prior of the Cathedral. In time he himself was elected Prior, and introduced rules and statutes to enliven the fervor of his canons. He served God in great regularity and poverty, in humility, mortification, meekness and fervor. The fame of his holiness spread about the country. Time and again bishoprics were offered to him; time and again he refused to accept. When the See of Gubbio became

vacant, he was sent with some clerics to beseech Pope Honorius II for a new bishop. The Pope selected and consecrated Ubaldus.

To his people Ubaldus became a perfect pattern of all Christian virtues, and a powerful protector in their temporal as well as spiritual needs. Ever a watchful shepherd, he convinced Emperor Frederick Barbarossa not to sack Gubbio as he had done other cities. In 1168 he died full of merits, after a long and painful illness of two years. Numerous miracles were wrought by him in life and after death. When Pope Celestine III canonized him in 1192, Ubaldus’ body was found flexible and incorrupt. His tomb and shrine is still a place of pilgrimage. His power, as we read in the Office for his feast, is chiefly manifested over the evil spirits.
