In the apostles.

The apostles experienced a great admiration and an immense joy. They did not grow tired of looking up to heaven; doing so gave them joy and strength. How many times during their labors and trials would they look up to heaven again and be comforted.

Moreover, their faith grew in a great manner on seeing the glorious crowning of the Life and Death of their Master. They realized at last what kind of Kingdom was His, and where it was! Their hope was strengthened through the promise of the sending of the Holy Spirit, and through the word pledged by Jesus of taking also them to that glory where He was going. Finally, their charity was also enlarged. How their love for their Master grew in their hearts! They realized more than ever how much Jesus had loved them.

Within us.

Ask Our Lady that something similar may happen in your heart - that your faith may be strengthened, that you may grow in the hope of Heaven, in the charity and love of Jesus. Ask her to remind you to look up to heaven, as the apostles did, above all in the hardships of life.

Ask her help to be detached from every earthly thing, that you may place your heart only in God and in your heavenly homeland. This will spur you towards labor, towards sacrifice, towards exactness in the fulfillment of your duties. It will fill you with that Holy Joy of which a Kempis spoke: *Those who think of, and hope in, Heaven cannot on this earth have one single moment of real sadness.*



FAITH OF OUR FATHERS, HOLY FAITH! WE WILL BE TRUE TO THEE 'TIL DEATH: ST FRANCIS CARACCILO

Five years after his ordination, Francis Caracciolo mistakenly received a letter addressed to another Caracciolo, begging for assistance in founding a new religious institute. Francis accepted the invitation, recognizing the Hand of God.

Perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament was one of the pillars of the new *Congregation of Clerics Regular Minor*, with the brothers taking turns before the tabernacle. They also bound themselves to various practices of daily penance: each day one brother should fast on bread and water, another would take the discipline, a third would wear the hair shirt.

Francis spent hours in the confessional, where he was enriched with gifts of prophecy and reading of hearts. He begged in the streets for the poor and gave away most of his possessions. But it was his devotion to the Blessed Sacrament for which St. Francis is most remembered. Such was his love for the Real Presence of Christ that he would spend almost entire nights in adoration. The little sleep he took was often spent on one of the altar steps. In presence of his divine Lord, his face usually emitted rays of light, and he often bathed the ground before the tabernacle with his tears. He spoke so constantly and movingly on the divine goodness that he was called "Preacher of the Love of God", and with the Sign of the Cross he restored health to many sick persons.

On the Vigil of Corpus Christi in 1608, he was in meditation until an hour before sunset. He suddenly cried out, "Let us go! Let us go to heaven!" Scarcely had these words been uttered when he passed to his reward. He was forty-four years of age.

When his body was opened after death, St. Francis' heart was found as it were burnt up, and these words imprinted around it: "*Zelus domus Tuæ comedit me*" - "The zeal of Thy house hath eaten me up."
