MAY THE GRACE OF THE MYSTERY OF PENTECOST COME DOWN INTO OUR SOULS!

A marvelous change has been worked in the apostles and disciples. In an instant the Holy Spirit has cleared away the obstacles He found in the soul of each. FAITH OF OUR FATHERS, HOLY FAITH! WE WILL BE TRUE TO THEE 'TIL DEATH: SAINTS PRIMUS AND FELICIAN, MARTYRS

The "Acts" of Saints Felician and Primus relate that they were brothers and patricians who converted to Christianity and suffered martyrdom about 304 in the persecution of Diocletian.

The constancy of Felician was first put to the test. Nailed hands and feet to the trunk of a tree, he remained hanging there for three days, without eating or drinking. They tried to make his brother believe that he had sacrificed to the idols, but Primus declared that he knew Felician was happy in the midst of his sufferings and that he would remain united to him in martyrdom. The praetor then ordered that molten lead should be poured into his mouth, in the presence of his brother.

They were led to the amphitheatre, but the lions who were to devour them crouched at their feet. Finally they were beheaded at Nomentum, twelve miles from Rome. St Primus was *eighty years old* at the time of his death. A church was built over their tombs on the Via Nomentana.
