Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus!



This devotion recognizes the immense love of the Son of God, which induced Him to deliver Himself to death for us and to give Himself entirely to us in the Sacrament of the altar. The thought of the ingratitude and the outrages which He was to receive until the end of time did not prevent Jesus from working this prodigy; He preferred to expose Himself to the insults and opprobrium of men, rather than be prevented from testifying to what excess He loved us.

How this has excited the piety and zeal of many people! Unable to endure seeing Him treated with contempt day after day, they endeavor to show their sorrow at such treatment. By their ardent love and profound respect, they prove their great desire to make reparation. This devotion consists, then, in ardently loving Jesus, always with us in the adorable Sacrament of the Eucharist, and showing this love by acts of reparation.

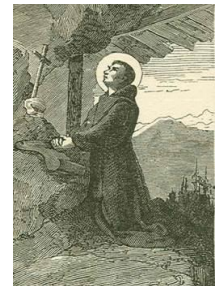
The Friday of each week is a day on which we should pay special honor to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. On this day our loving Saviour gave the supreme proof of His love for us by His death on the Cross; on this day His Sacred Heart was opened by a lance to be our place of refuge. It is just, therefore, that on each Friday we show the Sacred Heart some new marks of our love.

Our Lord said to St. Margaret Mary, "Be ready to receive Me, for I shall always be ready to give Myself to thee.
