### **A Reflection and a Resolution as we end the Month of the Holy Souls**

What benefits can flow from a visit to a Catholic cemetery?

A visit to a cemetery is an act of religion, as is the special care of the cemetery and the tombs of those buried there. It inspires a Catholic with reverence, awe for God's judgments and respect for the souls of those whose bodies are buried there; an awareness of the brevity of this earthly life and of the union of the Church Militant with the Church Suffering in the Mystical Body of Christ. Special graces are consequently attached to silent and prayerful visits to cemeteries.

However, if Catholics love to visit cemeteries, it is especially out of a motive of charity. Throughout the year, this visit may merit a partial indulgence. How can we refuse to take advantage of the unlocking of the Church's treasury, which simply depends on our visits and prayers?

Let us consequently be generous and regular with our visits to Catholic cemeteries, and let us never pass one without stopping to recite a short prayer for the poor souls there, or at least reciting such a prayer as we go by.
