 - a: an indulgence of 10 years;
 - b: a plenary indulgence if the ordinary conditions are met.

Bethlehem did not rise up and thrust Him out of its precincts as Nazareth did later. He had to seek outside for such shelter as a stable could give, simply because there was no room for Him in the little place. It was crowded up with other things. Is my heart a Bethlehem?

Words on the Advent Prayer sheet**

Bethlehem was His own city. Yet there was no room. "He came unto His own, and His own received Him not." I am His own, and He comes to me. "Behold I stand at the door and knock." Do I rise and open to Him? Or do I say from behind the closed door, "There is no room"?

Some creature, some passion, some sin, perhaps, disputes my heart with Thee, Lord! There is no room.

Thou cravest a larger space in my life, in my day - a Communion at less distant intervals, a few minutes taken from pleasure or from trifles to visit Thy neglected tabernacle. But it would not be convenient, it would interfere with my arrangements. There is no room.

How long, O Lord, how long! Remember that whilst Thou waitest our consent, and wilt offer no violence to our free will, Thou art still God, and all power is given to Thee in heaven and on earth.

Make room for Thyself within my heart, O Lord! Say in the tone of authority of days gone by: "Take these things hence." "Take the stumbling-blocks out of My way." "The place is too straight for Me, make Me room to dwell in." And I will make answer: "My heart is ready, O God, my heart is ready."

First Fruit of the Christmas Cycle: Saint Stephen

Would you like to learn more about the first saint honored during the celebration of Our Lord's birth, the "Proto-Martyr" Saint Stephen? Read Acts, beginning halfway through Chapter 6. The saint was and spoke as one "full of grace and power", so that he was seized and brought before the Sanhedrin. Chapter 7 relates his breath-taking defense of the New Law, as those who listened "gazing upon him, saw his face as though it were the face of an angel" though he neither spared words nor soft-touched the truth as he concluded "Stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ear, you always oppose the Holy Spirit!"

The end of the chapter tells of his final moments; how he "looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God"; how, after he was rushed out of the city and as the stones rained down on him, "Stephen prayed and said, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit' ... 'Lord, do not lay this sin against them.' And with these words he fell asleep."

Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, so to imitate what we revere, that we may learn to love even our enemies; for we celebrate the heavenly birthday of him who knew how to pray for his very persecutors to our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son. Amen.
