*January: Month of the Divine Infancy and the Holy Name of Jesus*

In 1629, the Carmelite convent in Prague received the gift of a statue of the Holy Infant. The little Lord is in the guise of a King, His left hand holding a globe surmounted by a Cross, symbol of His universal Kingship; His right raised in the act of blessing. On presenting the statue to the prior, the pious donor said to the Prior, "I offer you, dear Father, what I love most in this world. Honor this Child Jesus and be certain that as long as you venerate Him you will lack nothing."

Prague was overcome and pillaged by Saxon armies in 1630. The Carmelites fled, and the mercenaries who occupied the monastery knocked the statue of the Holy Infant into a pile of wreckage behind the main altar. When a truce was accomplished and the Carmelites returned to their monastery, they completely forgot about the statue of the Holy Infant. In 1637 Father Cyril, one of the refugees, was reassigned to the Carmelite Monastery in Prague. He sought, and after some time found the statue in a heap of rubble. Overjoyed, he again placed the statue in the oratory. Gazing upon the simple statue of the Child Jesus, the good religious contemplated the most marvelous event in the history of the world, the Incarnation. He was filled with awe and wonder as he prayed to the God Who became a child for love for us.

Suddenly, the statue spoke to him. Father Cyril was stunned as he heard these words of promise:

*"HAVE MERCY ON ME AND I WILL HAVE MERCY ON YOU.  
GIVE ME HANDS AND I WILL GIVE YOU PEACE.*

*THE MORE YOU HONOR ME, THE MORE I WILL BLESS YOU."*

Startled, Father Cyril examined the statue, and drawing aside its robe, he found that both hands of the statue were broken off. He did not know how to repair it himself, nor could the monastery afford to commission an artist for the task. Fr Cyril appealed to the Blessed Mother to provide the necessary funds for fixing the Infant statue. His prayer was answered one day when the Divine Infant spoke to him again: *"Place Me near the entrance of the sacristy and you will receive aid."* Fr Cyril did so and in a few days' time, a benefactor offered to take care of the repairs.

Though civil conflicts have arisen in Prague time and again, the church and the Infant Jesus chapel have been miraculously protected, and the devotion has spread throughout the entire world.
