
Announcements . . .

- * **May shrine** ~ It's the last week of our Mother's beautiful month! Ending on the Feast of Pentecost; how appropriate!
- * The Annual **Novena for Pentecost** will be prayed after every Holy Mass this week. *For making a Novena to the Holy Ghost either before Pentecost or at any other time of the year, one may gain an indulgence of 7 years once on any day of the novena.*
- * **Vigil of Pentecost** is a day of Fast & Partial Abstinence. Meat is permitted for all Catholics at least 7 years of age, only once (at the main meal) this day. The Lenten Fast is required for all aged 21- 59 on this day, in preparation for the grand festival of Pentecost, unless legitimately excused.


De Maria Nunquam Satis: Of Mary there is never enough!

If through His infinite charity Jesus has made Himself our bail and our Mediator with God His Father, in order to appease Him and to pay Him what we owed Him, are we, on that account, to have less respect and less fear for His Majesty and His Sanctity?

Let us say with the saints: we have need of a mediator with the Mediator Himself, and it is the divine Mary who is the most capable of filling that charitable office. It was through her that Jesus Christ came to us, and it is through her that we must go to Him. If we fear to go directly to Jesus Christ, our God, (whether because of His infinite greatness, or because of our vileness, or because of our sins), let us boldly implore the aid and intercession of Mary, our Mother. She is good, she is tender, she has nothing in her austere and forbidding, nothing too sublime and too brilliant. In seeing her, we see our pure nature. *She is not the sun, which by the brightness of its rays blinds us because of our weakness; but she is fair and gentle as the moon, which receives the light of the sun, and tempers it to make it more suitable to our capacity.* She is so charitable that she repels none of those who ask her intercession, no matter how great sinners they have been; for, as the saints say, never has it been heard since the world was the world that anyone has confidently and perseveringly had recourse to our Blessed Lady and yet has been repelled. She is so powerful that none of her petitions has ever been refused. She has but to show herself before her Son to pray to Him, and straightway He grants her desires, straightway He receives her prayers. He is always lovingly vanquished by the prayers of His dearest Mother, who bore Him and nourished Him.

Sr Lucia of Fatima, On the Power of the Rosary

"Father, the Most Holy Virgin said to my cousins as well as to myself, that God is giving two last remedies to the world. These are the Holy Rosary and devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. "The Most Holy Virgin, in these last times in which we live, has given a new efficacy to the recitation of the Rosary. She has given this efficacy to such an extent that there is no problem, no matter how difficult it is, whether temporal or above all spiritual, in the personal life of each one of us, of our families, of the families of the world or of the religious communities, or even of the life of peoples and nations, that cannot be solved by the Rosary. There is no problem, I tell you, no matter how difficult it is, that we cannot resolve by the prayer of the Holy Rosary. "With the Holy Rosary we will save ourselves. We will sanctify ourselves. We will console Our Lord and obtain the salvation of many souls."
