Reflections on the Gifts of the Holy Ghost

 <p>Station at St Peter's</p>	<p>The Gift of Wisdom is an illumination of the Holy Ghost, thanks to which our intellect is able to look at revealed truths in their more sublime light, to the greater joy of our souls.</p>
 <p>Station at Saint Peter in Chains</p>	<p>The Gift of Understanding enlightens us by shedding a clear, searching and extraordinary light on the meaning of revealed truth, and by giving us a certitude that what God has revealed bears such and such a sense and no other.</p>
 <p>Station at St Anastasia's</p>	<p>The Gift of Counsel is a light given by the Holy Ghost, by means of which our practical intellect sees and judges rightly both what should be done in individual cases, and the best means to do it.</p>
 <p>Station at St Mary Major</p>	<p>The Gift of Fortitude is a permanent power which the Holy Ghost communicates to our will to assist us in overcoming the difficulties which might deter us in the practice of what is right.</p>
 <p>Station at St Laurence outside-the-Walls</p>	<p>The Gift of Knowledge is a supernatural light of the Holy Ghost which shows us the credibility and acceptability of revealed truths, even for reasons which are based only on the order of creation.</p>
 <p>Station at the Church of the Twelve Apostles</p>	<p>The Gift of Piety awakens in our souls an inclination and readiness to honor God as our Father, and to have a filial confidence in Him.</p>
 <p>Station at Saint Peter's</p>	<p>The Gift of Holy Fear, or the Fear of God, is actually the foundation of all other gifts. It drives sin from the heart, because it fills us with reverence for the Justice of God or His divine Majesty.</p>

Mary and the Seven Gifts ~

The Annunciation: Fear of the Lord

Mary manifests right judgment about divine things – Fear of the Lord confirms her as the Seat of Wisdom. What is Mary's response? The profound humility that is Fear's effect. "Behold the handmaid of the Lord. Be it done unto me according to thy word."

The Visitation: Piety

Piety concerns fulfilling our duty and conscientious service toward God and all things related to Him - the saints, sacred objects -, towards our parents

and superiors, our country. Mary exhibits this by bringing Jesus to Elizabeth, and to us, out of reverence for and service to God.

The Presentation in the Temple: Knowledge

Knowledge provides sure and correct judgment about things of faith. It blessed Simeon with sure and correct judgment about the identity of Jesus and moved him to the conviction that the Baby Mary gave him was the very Object of his faith, hope, and love.

The Finding in the Temple: Fortitude

Fortitude is a kind of firmness of mind needed for doing good and enduring evil. That was the kind of situation Mary and Joseph faced. Chiefly, Fortitude enables us to supernaturally stand our ground amidst dangers so as to reach the end of a good work begun.

The Feast of Cana: Counsel

Counsel pertains to everything leading to eternal life. The counsel and maternal mediation of Mary keeps us headed in Jesus' direction, especially when she sees our spiritual needs that the love of her Son is guaranteed to transform.

"Who is My Mother?" Understanding

Understanding considers eternal and necessary truths as reliable rules for human conduct. It leads us to perform *divinely directed* human actions. That is why the "mother" of God is one who devotedly does God's will.

The Passion: Wisdom

Wisdom judges all things according to divine truth. It enabled Mary to embrace the ultimate need for her Son to die for our redemption. Mary's faith-filled wisdom leads her to regard the bitterness of the Passion solely according to God's Will and God's Love.



God Father, praise and glory Thy children bring to Thee;
