St Gertrude the Great

*How we must carry our cross after Jesus Christ,
and how the mercy of God chastises the elect.*


Gertrude beheld Our Lord walking on a road which seemed pleasant, because of the beauty of the verdure and flowers which covered it, but which nevertheless was narrow, and rough with thorns. Then she beheld a cross which went before Him, and separated the thorns from one another, making the road wider and more easy; while the Savior turned to those who came after Him, and encouraged them, looking at them with a sweet and loving countenance, and saying: "Let him that will come after Me take up his cross, and deny himself, and follow Me." By this she knew that our temptations are our crosses. For example: it is a cross to one person to be obliged by obedience to do what she dislikes; to another to be restrained. Now, each ought so to carry his cross as to be willing to suffer with a good heart all that crosses him, and yet to neglect nothing which he thinks may be for the glory of God.

Revelations of Saint Gertrude

It is of greatest benefit to us to unite our prayer with that which our Divine Mediator offers for us upon the altar, imploring Him to make it one with His; for this union will render it so powerful that no other prayer can compare with it. In virtue of the merits of Christ's Passion, the prayers offered in union with the Holy Sacrifice have infinitely more value than any other prayers, however long and however fervent. Therefore, if we unite our poor petitions which we offer during Mass to the perfect prayer of Our Lord, they will, like a copper coin immersed in molten gold, be beautified and ennobled, and rendered meet to be borne to heaven as a precious oblation.


- An indulgence of 3 years: may be gained once on each day of November, by the faithful who recite prayers or perform other devout exercise in supplication for the faithful departed; a plenary indulgence if the devotions are performed daily for the entire month.
- An indulgence of 7 years: applicable only to the departed, may be gained on any day of the year when the faithful visit a cemetery in a spirit of piety and devotion and pray, even mentally, for the dead. Usual conditions apply.

Bishop Pivarunas' dispensation from the Precept of Attending Mass on Sundays and Holydays will continue as long as the pandemic is active within the state, or until further notice from His Excellency.
