The Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ

St Remigius says that the kings were successors of Balaam, and came at the sight of the star by the prophecy of their father, which said that a star would rise out of Jacob.

It happened that on the day of the Nativity of Jesus Christ, a star came over them as they watched the heavens, which had the form of a right fair child, and under his head was a shining cross. The kings were told: Go ye hastily into the land of Judea, and there ye shall find the king that ye seek, which is born of a virgin.

When they came into Jerusalem, these wise men demanded not *if* the King was born, for they believed firmly that He *was* born. If any asked of them: Whereby know ye that He is born? They answered: We have seen His star in the Orient, and therefore we come to worship Him. Again, St Remigius says that by these words they confessed this Child true man * *where is He born* *, true King * *that is King of the Jews* *, and true God * *we have come to worship Him* *.

It is said in the Holy Gospel that they entered into the house and found the Child with Mary His mother, and they worshipped Him. They knelt and offered to Him their gifts of gold, incense, and myrrh.

S. Jerome saith: "This is a heaven where is no light but the star. O palace celestial in which Thou dwellest, not as King adorned with precious stones, but in human flesh. To Whom, for a soft bed was given a hard crib, and for curtains of gold and silk, the stench of dung; but the star of heaven was clearly embellished. I am abashed when I behold these clothes and see the heaven. My heart burneth me when I see Him in the crib, a poor mendicant, and over Him the stars. I see Him right clear, right noble, and right rich. O ye kings, what do ye? Ye worship the Child in a little house wrapped in poor cloths. Is He then not God? Ye offer to Him gold - whereof is He King, and where is His royal hall? Where is His throne? Where is His court royal, frequented and filled with nobles? The stable, is it not His imperial hall? And His throne, is it not the animals' manger?"


O holy Kings,
