### Meditation on the 15<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost

*From the Year Made Holy by Msgr Matthias Premm*

The greater our love for poor sinners, the sooner will our prayer be heard. We shall see the fulfillment of that for which we pray in the *Collect*: "Let thy pity, O Lord, continue to cleanse and defend thy church; and because without thee she cannot abide in safety, ever govern her by thy grace."

Through the undeserved grace of God and not by any merit of our own we hope that we are at present in the state of grace and are thus not numbered among the spiritually dead. But here again we must be cautioned: he that thinks himself to live, let him take heed lest he die. How much we too are exposed to sin, and thereby to death and corruption! The *Epistle* reminds us: "Brethren, if we live in the spirit, let us also walk in the spirit!" Before the eyes of all the world we must lead a life of vigorous and living Christianity. If we go through, one by one, the exhortations of the Apostle Paul and examine ourselves honestly on them we shall discover that in ourselves too there is much that is tainted with the corruption of death, in some of us more, in others less. We hanker after empty glory, we provoke one another, we are envious of one another. When we have to correct the faults of others, we do not do it in the spirit of charity and meekness. We do not bear one another's burdens. We think ourselves to be something, whereas, of ourselves, we are nothing. And so we delude ourselves. "Be not deceived" – the Apostle warns us sternly – "God is not mocked!" Therefore we turn our longing gaze toward Jesus, the restorer of the dead to life, not only out of love for those who are living in mortal sin, but also in awareness of our own frailty and weakness. Jesus has already snatched us from death once before, at our Baptism, and perhaps also many times since then in the sacrament of Penance. For this we give Him thanks in the *Gradual*: "It is good to give praise to the Lord; and to sing to thy name, O Most High. To show forth thy mercy in the morning [now, at the Holy Mass], and thy truth in the night."

And now in the *Gospel* the Savior appears, to show us by practical demonstration that He does truly raise from the dead. Filled with joy we salute Him: "Alleluia! The Lord (Jesus Christ) is a great God, and a great King over all the earth." And when Jesus then commands: "Young man, I say to thee, arise!" we must take this command as being addressed to us personally. Yes, O my Savior, I will arise from my lukewarmness, to live wholly and only for Thee. What happiness would then be mine! Then would be fulfilled the words of the *Offertory hymn*: "With expectation I have waited for the Lord, and he had regard to me; and he heard my prayer, and he put a new canticle into my mouth, a song to our God!"
