**Feast of Christ the King– Meditation & Propers**

*From the Marian Missel by Sylvester P Juergens, S.M.*

The royalty of Christ rests upon a twofold basis. He is our King by right of birth and by right of conquest. The first refers us to the personality of the Son of God, whereby, in His divine nature as God and by virtue of the hypostatic union, He is the sovereign Lord and Master. The second places before us the God-man coming down on earth to rescue fallen man from the slavery of Satan, and by the labors and sufferings of His life, and passion, and death, to win a glorious victory for us over sin and hell.

**Introit**

The Lamb that was slain is worthy to receive power and divinity and wisdom and strength and honor; to Him be glory and empire for ever and ever. –(Ps. 71.1). Give to the King, O God, Thy justice, and to the King’s Son Thy judgment. V. Glory be...

**Collect**

Almighty and everlasting God, who in Thy beloved Son, the King of the whole world, hast willed to restore all things mercifully grant that all the kindreds of the nations that are divided by the wound of sin, may be brought under the sweet yoke of His rule. Who liveth and reigneth with God the Father ...

**Gradual**

He shall rule from sea to sea, and from the river to the end of the earth. V. And all kings shall adore Him, all nations shall serve Him. Alleluia, alleluia. V. (Dan. 7.14.). His power shall be an everlasting power, which shall not be taken away; and His kingdom a kingdom that shall not decay. Alleluia.

**Toties Quoties Indulgence**

Beginning on November 1<sup>st</sup> at noon and continuing to midnight, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Catholic faithful, as often as they visit a church to pray for the dead, reciting 6 times during the visit the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for the intentions of Holy Mother Church, may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the souls in Purgatory.
