sigh;

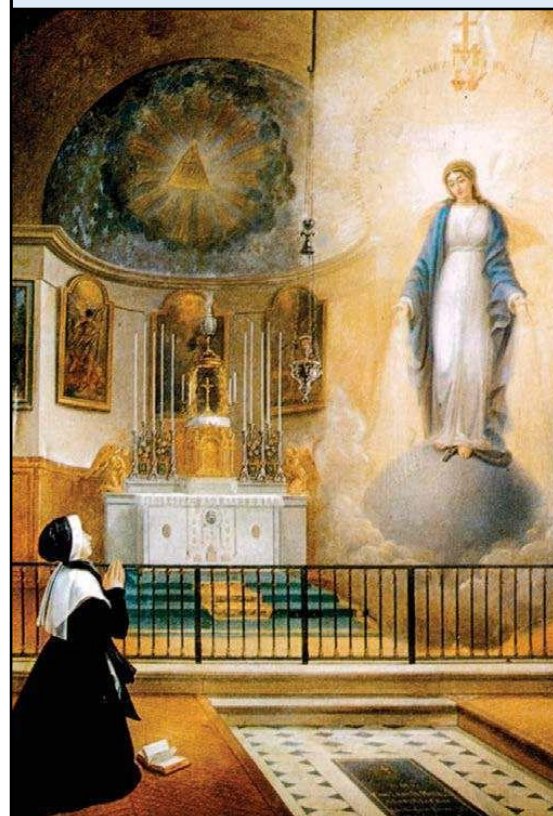
If sins of man Thou scann'st, who may
